BOTSWANA TRACKING LIONS WITH THE PROS

what: How to show a lion you're friendly? By rubbing whiskers with bigcat specialists in the field and learning about the issues facing lions and leopards. Your safari—in the famed Okavango Delta—supports efforts to protect Africa's beleaguered felines.

WHEN: Oct. 2013 – Nov. 2014 (blackout dates Dec. 19 – Jan. 11).

THE DIGS: Zarafa Camp and either Selinda Explorers Camp or Duba Plains Camp, two of the three swanky sanctuaries designed by Dereck and Beverly Joubert, researchers and documentary filmmakers.
