

AFRICA BOTSWANA Among Bushmen | 😁 👣 🕞

Meet the spiritual leaders of one of the last surviving groups of Bushmen—the oldest indigenous peoples on earth—who still practice aspects of their traditional hunter-gatherer lifestyle. During your time with the Bushmen, you'll watch a sacred heal-

ing-trance dance and also learn about their present-day struggles: While this particular community remains on its ancestral land near the Namibian border, the Botswanan government has forced some of those inside the Central Kalahari Game Reserve off their land and placed them in resettlement camps. In the Company of Lions | 6.

Do research on lions and track leopards in the Kwando Reserve. Scientists with the African Predator Conservation Research Organization are studying the health and long-term

viability of these carnivore populations. Each night, you will help dart lions, collect DNA samples, and closely observe the immobilized animals. Cost: \$2,000 donation. Source: Cherri Briggs (see No. 1).

Dr. Zahi Hawass, secretary general of the Supreme Council of Antiquities, will personally escort you through the Egyptian Museum's preeminent collection of artifacts for two to three hours, presenting the kingdom's broad and complicated history in layperson's terms. If Cairo is your entry point to a larger Egypt itinerary, he can focus on relics from the regions you'll later visit. Cost: \$8,000. 
KENYA

Masai-Style Barbecue | 1 1 1 1 1

Take part in an authentic meat roast on the Oloololo Escarpment in the Masai Mara. More than 300 warriors arrive from nearby villages to prepare and cook a cow and II goats during the day. At sunset, you'll gather around the campfire for the feast, followed by dancing and singing. Cost: \$1,500 in food contributions. MADAGASCAR Moving the Dead | (†)

Attend a Famadihana, a Malagasy ceremony in which the deceased are moved between tombs on the anniversary of their death to reaffirm their link with living relatives. Not for the faint of heart, festivities in the village of Soatanana typically last two days and include the sacri-

NIGER Giraffes in the Sahara | 🖰

Examine ancient life-size giraffe carvings, the famously beautiful and realistic subjects of rock art dating back to 8000 B.C. Discovered in the barren landscape of the Sahara only six years ago, the 828 figures—representing cows, lions, and of course giraffes—are testimony to the region's former lushness. This extremely remote World Heritage Site is closed to the public. Cost: \$400. Source: Cherri Briggs (see No. 1).

SOUTH AFRICA At Desmond Tutu's Table | ©

Join Archbishop Desmond Tutu for lunch in Cape Town. This high school teacher and priest was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1984 for being "a unifying leader in the campaign to resolve the problem of apartheid in South Africa." During the meal, he'll discuss his past and ongoing human rights work worldwide. Cost: \$10,000 or more in a donation to one of Tutu's charities. The Origins of Man | 🖰

Explore an active dig in the Cradle of Humankind, a World Heritage Site 45 minutes from Johannesburg. At Drimolen, a section closed to the public, researchers have unearthed 79 hominid and prehominid fossils, the third-richest find in southern Africa. A leading paleontologist will show you around the excavations. Cost: \$600. Source: Joel Zack, Heritage Tours, New York City (800-378-4555; joel@heritagetoursonline.com; heritagetoursonline.com).

A Zulu Welcome | (1)

Meet the leader of the Zulu nation, King Goodwill Zwelithini kaBhekuzulu, who during his reign over KwaZulu-Natal has worked to revive the traditions and customs of his people, South Africa's largest ethnic group, and to promote AIDS education. The king, however, has drawn criticism for his lavish lifestyle. Cost: \$1,000. Source: Cherri Briggs

Dine in Cape Town's Groote Schuur, the president's official residence, where Nelson Mandela lived and carried out negotiations with the apartheid regime. Current president Thabo Mbeki resides in a less formal building on the grounds. Before the meal, a curator will show you around the nineteenth-century Cape Dutch mansion. Cost: \$2,000. 12 On Camelback with the Samburu | ① Spend a day with Samburu warriors from a remote village that's rarely visited by tourists. Ride camels with them across the Northern Frontier District, then climb the sacred mountain of Ololokwe. At the top, the warriors will assign you a Samburu moniker, and the elders might invite you back to their village if a wedding or a school ceremony is taking place. Cost: \$1,000.
